## Fairseat News - 17<sup>th</sup> March 2020

- Link Meeting, 16<sup>th</sup> March this was held and well attended by residents and some family who were able to join us. Essentially it was agreed that Fairseat would go into "lockdown" with all non-essential visits outside of Fairseat to be cancelled. In addition, it was also understood that all non-essential visitors from outside Fairseat would be strongly discouraged. The unique situation that Fairseat faces with the grim prognosis if we cannot control these factors was well understood. The ongoing situation will be reviewed regularly. So right now, no visitors including family members, from outside Fairseat should come in. No residents from inside should go out at all unless it is for critical reasons. If in doubt, please talk to Ben.
- External services as explained at the LINK meeting, all services provided by an outsider have been cancelled temporarily. Not forever, but until further notice. So Carmen will not be doing hairdressing until further notice. If you don't need an actual cut or perm then see Carolyne and she can organize for Lydia to wash & set your hair for you. Anne Ndegwa is doing manicures & pedicures for her last residents on Wednesday and then will not be coming for at least 4 weeks. All massage services have been canceled for now including Maria, Peninah and Norah. Likewise, all non-essential physio services are discontinued. The monthly Anglican Communion Service has been cancelled. Njoroge from Muthaiga Travel will only be available for essential, time critical, stuff. We will review this as circumstances evolve and please talk to me if you have problems or concerns.
- "Self-Isolation" for residents Fairseat is fortunate that it is reasonably easy for some residents to "self-isolate" and for other residents to continue to live a relatively normal life within the confines of Fairseat. Any residents wishing to "self-isolate" but having problems with the logistics or management of it should speak to Ben or Yvonne S. (by telephone!). Anyone who feels that the security offered by Fairseat is not enough can speak to Ben who has spoken to a prominent local hotel keen to fill their empty rooms and are offering a secure lockdown service. I have no costs but I think they would be competitive.
- **Building work** I have spoken to the builders and they are going to work through the next two weekends in order to speed up the progress of the build. I expect the main kitchen to be completed and operational by 5<sup>th</sup> April. The staff area should be finished and available for them to use again by this date. The structural portion of the dining room work will be completed by then as well so new floor, new windows and doors; new ceilings, lighting and fireplace; new patio area with a sail. We will remain with the interior furnishings for Karen to weave her magic touch with and apply all the finishing touches to. There is new furniture ordered for the patio and new dining chairs and tables for the main dining room which will take a bit longer to arrive.
- Resident dining area in trying to reduce risk to residents, we will stop using the rear parking area for resident dining and return to having all meals in residences. We will also close access to the walkway behind the kitchen to all residents. This reduces the issue of overcrowding, unintended contact and using shared spaces between residents, our staff and contract building labour that was tending to occur. The paved area between the nurse's office and the accounts' office will now be off-limits for all residents. If you are doing your Fairseat circuit walk in a clockwise fashion then you will have to turn right at the nurses office and use the corridor before either walking up the path to where John G. parks his car or going around the outside of the Widgery Room and continuing up towards the main gate. Residents who are not planning to "self-isolate" are encouraged to "eat out" & socialize by inviting their fellow residents to eat lunch together with them and arranging the logistics with their carers. Likewise, for morning & afternoon tea.

- Lockdown living any residents who need supplies during our lockdown should see the office. Whilst we do not normally advertise such services, the fact is that there is little that our faithful driver Stephen has not been asked to buy over the years. We have a very competitive supplier of booze who will deliver to Fairseat and you simply order through the office. Anything of a particularly private nature can be discussed with the nurses. If in doubt, simply talk to Carolyne in the office.
- Room 2 Work on refurbishing this room can only start once the staff area has been completed so I imagine that it will begin Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> April. That will allow us to have it ready for Nigel Brierley's arrival at Fairseat at the beginning of May.
- Exercise and activities as a result of our lockdown and exclusion of all unnecessary outside visitors, we are naturally left with a few voids. Yvonne has kindly offered to do Thursday morning exercises until we can invite Sheila back. Jane has agreed to call the bingo. Fiona will continue to organize the Saturday morning bridge. The real issue though is to decide what to do with the boys how will XXXX survive without his monthly rugby outing? Can XXXX get by without playing bowls every Sunday? What will XXXX do without 16 holes every second day of the week? And what will any of us do without international sport to watch no tennis, no soccer, no rugby, no golf?
